Ten Frames For Home

- 1. Carefully cut out ten frame cards. Make sure to stay on the lines and cut off extra paper.
- 2. Sort the ones from the tens. Put the tens in a zip lock bag or envelope.
- 3. Use the ones for an activity:
 - a. Fast flash them and say how many you see.
 - b. Sort them greatest to least or least to greatest.
 - c. Say the equation for what's there and what's missing. (Example: If you see one dot, the equation is 1+9=10). See how fast you can do this!
- 4. Play Go Fish with your ten frames (combine cards that make 10).
- 5. Store all the ten frames in the plastic bag or envelope.


Keep these ten frames in a safe place. Listen in class for many more activities and games to play at home throughout the year with your ten frames. NAME

Tens Go Fish Directions


You need

- Deck of Primary Number
 Cards (without Wild Cards)
- Tens Go Fish Recording
 Sheet (G45; 1 per player)



Play with a partner. Work together.

- Deal each player 5 cards.
- Players put down pairs of cards that make 10, and pick new cards to replace them.
- Then, players take turns asking each other for a card that will make 10 with a card in their own hand.
 - If a player gets the card, he or she puts the pair down and picks a new card from the deck.
 - If a player does not get the card, the player must "Go fish" and pick a new card from the deck.
 - If the new card makes 10 with a card in the player's hand, he or she puts the pair down and picks another card.
 - If a player runs out of cards, the player picks two new cards.
 - A player's turn is over when there are no more pairs that make 10.
- The game is over when there are no more cards.
- At the end of the game, players record their combinations of 10 on the *Tens Go Fish*Recording Sheet.
